DIRECTOR REPORTS

President

2020-2021 has been a successful year for the Club despite the many challenges we had to face. Covid-19 required us to change many things that we had taken for granted in past years: patrol operations, Sunday nippers, competition, club house operation, social interactions, bar operation and many other things were curtailed or modified to comply with the impact of Covid restrictions.

Our club met all these challenges because of the hard work of so many members. A huge thank you to everyone who stepped up to help, well done!!!

The Board members were instrumental in achieving such a successful year, and I want to thank my fellow Board members for the wonderful job they all did and the amazing support they provided to my role as President.

The patrol statistics for 2019-20 demonstrate that we delivered on our core responsibility of providing a safer beach:

- Patrol Hours6,580
- Beach Attendance patrol hours:67,000
- Preventative Actions:879
- First Aids:53
- Ambulance call outs.....2
- Beach Closed.....10
- Rescues:6

Our first aid actions included: 1 spinal injury, 1 oxy viva administration, 1 bone fracture and 1 major wound. These are very impressive statistics. I want to congratulate all our patrol members who formed 12 Patrols this year. Each patrol was well trained and equipped. The quality of our training was demonstrated in each rescue, first aid, preventative action.

Our membership numbers were maintained at healthy levels despite Covid, which impacted the number of nippers we could accept and also affected our Associate memberships.

The Club's finances were very well managed through a difficult year. Our major income stream from bar operations was greatly reduced, fund raising activities and raffles were restricted and other regular income sources were limited.

The Board implemented a Covid-19 budget to guide the Club's finances through 2020-21, with expenditure tightly controlled. This proved a very successful strategy and we were strongly supported by our donors, sponsors and supporters who were very generous.

Our annual door knock went "virtual" this year and we achieved the best result ever from this important and traditional January event. Our financial management team under the leadership of Director John Evans is to be congratulated. The Club's financial statements speak to this success, with our cash balance actually increasing over the course of the year.

Junior activities were a stunning success this year, with all junior member and parents able to enjoy the beach and Sunday activities in a Covid Safe way. The amount of work that was necessary behind the scenes and on the beach to enable nippers to happen this year was amazing. Thank you to everyone who made this happen.

Our performance at all levels of competition was very strong this year, despite some limits on the way events could be run. Our boat crews did well and continued the success we have always shown in this iconic sport. A special thank you to Peter Norman, who is stepping down from the role of Boat Captain after 42 years in the role, a truly amazing commitment to the Club.

The biggest highlight of the year was a Gold Medal at the Australian Titles to Skye Hackshall in the under 14 Surf Race.

I especially want to thank retiring Directors Graham Johnson (Education), David White (Administration) and John Evans (Finance). Their commitment and hard work over many years has been pivotal to the success and growth of our Club, thank you, very, very much.

The Club recognised three new Life Members this year, congratulations to Warren Watkins, Jan Sillato and Alan Blackman.

I want to thank everyone who worked so hard to achieve a successful year and acknowledge the wonderful support provided by Local, State and Federal Governments representatives and Surf Life Saving Central Coast.

As will be appreciated by all, the Covid challenged year put pressure on all aspects of the club's operations. As is invariably the case, pressure identifies the weaknesses in a system. The club has responded to this, as it should and many but not all others do or can, resulting in repair and changes thus strengthening the organization.

The Covid threat brought uncertainty and then dynamic covid rules forcing a virtual cessation of any club operations. This created potential for challenge to community support, membership retention, sponsor and community support and the consequent uncertainty as income.

The bar was closed and contractors such as the cleaners put on hold. The café was challenged and our rental income flow threatened.

There was little or no activity around the club. Being a voluntarily operated entity, unlike other clubs, there was no job keeper or other government financial support. All non-essential activity and expenditure was stopped. In the interests of members and the community nothing happened at the club for some months

The 2019/2020 season got to an end. By the time for preparation for the 2020/2021 season covid rules were in place. This required material work and dedication by club officers and there was much reforming of principles and processes required and implemented.

The club, the board and the many members responsible for the club's operation, strength and vitality recognized the challenges, accepted what had to be alternate (and sometimes better) processes and approaches. The club continued to do what the club does and has done for many decades albeit with some restrictions and by some different processes.

Many of the steps taken due to covid have strengthened the club.

The success of the last season, in the challenging circumstances that applied, is manifest by the club's financial position being stronger than it was at the same time the previous year, the membership is at the same 700-member level as it was the year before covid. All pre covid activities of the club continue to operate despite challenges and social pressures that have not been equaled for many decades.

The club can heave a sigh of relief but cannot slacken as the challenges continue.

Having had six years as a member of the board it is time for

regeneration. My position is being taken by Pat Roberts who I congratulate on being elected. She is fortunate to become part of the competent and effective club management team which includes the board and all those who give their time so willingly to keep the club on an even keel.

Whilst I will miss it, every organization must evolve and regenerate. This is even more important for a voluntary organization such as the club where there must always be new people to come forward to contribute.

This is particularly important today when societal dictates are changing so rapidly. The essence of this club is its voluntary operation which is a material contributor to its ethos. The challenge will be to maintain this 'voluntary' operation and all that goes with it. Some adjustments may well be required.

The club is a small but complex organisation subject to a number of demanding and prescriptive regulatory regimes which apply to the small as well as the large organizations. The demands for compliance are compounded by the expectations of a society in which individuals do not hesitate to require compliance.

I have enjoyed my six years on the board. I thank all of those members who have worked directly with me for their invaluable support without which I could not have done my job.

Thank you for the opportunity and privilege to serve and I wish the club to continue to be as it is.

I look forward to my ongoing membership and involvement with the club.

The 2020/2021 financial year for the Surf Club like many other sporting club and businesses in Australia was heavily impacted by COVID 19. When the board met in March 2020 and agreed on a budget for the ensuing year May 2020 to April 2021, a loss of \$60, 000 for the year was regarded as being a realistic figure. With bar trading unlikely, reduced income from café rental, hall hire and the uncertainty of donations, sponsorship and membership, income for the club would take a severe downturn.

Revenue for the year of \$229,224 was down almost 45% over the average for the previous four years \$409,902. Bar income of \$20,596 made up only 9% of the club's revenue for the year compared to an average of 43% for the previous four years. A pleasing feature of the year was that other income streams of the club café rental, donations, sponsorship and membership income all remained in line with their averages of the past four years.

Expenditure for year was \$185,936 a reduction of over 40% from the previous years. Reductions in bar purchases, cleaning, small equipment purchased and repairs and maintenance being the major contributors to the lower overall expenditure figure. As a result, even with the lower income, tight controls over expenditure saw the club post a profit of \$43,288 for the year compared to a loss of -\$22,128 for the 2019/20 year an outstanding result in a very tough economic climate. This year has demonstrated that the club's has the ability to manage downturns without impacting the club's future viability.

Cash Flow (bank balance) for the club shows a positive increase of \$64,314 and 27% over the previous year's cash figure with another \$15,236 being spent on capital expenditure (assets). Depreciation, (noncash expenditure) was \$50,512 for the year compared to \$57,359 in the previous year.

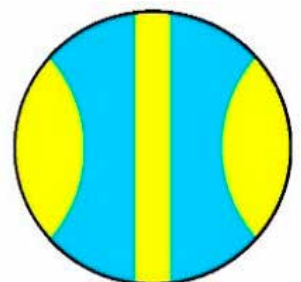

Preparation for the 20/21 season was vastly different from previous years with the restrictions and uncertainty of Covid 19 casting a cloud over the delivery and re-qualifications of new and existing awards at MacMasters Beach. The message from the education team at the beginning of the season was to, “keep it simple”, as promotion and expansion of the clubs patrolling teams was limited under the guidelines presented by Surf NSW relating to Covid 19.

“Delegates” were approved from most patrols to deliver the practical component of proficiency award requalification. This was in part successful, especially with the positive assistance provided by Lyn Drummond, who visited each patrol to engage members in completing their compulsory “online portal” requirements of each proficiency. Portal registration is now a requirement for all active patrol members and unfortunately is another burden on a volunteer arriving at the beach to provide water safety for the general public. To those active delegates who engaged in the training of their patrolling teams a huge thanks. Once again, our large team of boaties were active participants in the early proficiency requalification process, many thanks to all of those teams for their positive response process. Many thanks to all those teams for their positive response.

Patrolling teams with rookies emerging to Bronze Medallion stage were encouraged to assist and complete this bronze training. Many thanks to Vince and Pat Roberts for the active involvement and encouragement which progressed their younger patrolling members in achieving the Bronze Medallion. Surf NSW provided compulsory online training modules to reduce face to face training which encouraged active training on regular rostered patrols.

Nipper parents were again targeted for award qualification in Surf Rescue Certificate to assist in carnival water safety. Once again online training, delegate assistance and competency-based assessment enable completion of this award in a Covid 19 year, together with the rookies gaining this award for the first time

The smiling faces of nippers learning CPR and water safety skills is all the motivation that this trainer requires to keep motivated. The manikins on the grass area, with nippers covered in sand pumping out CPR with defibrillators, is truly inspiring, and highly praised by the large crowds of community members quietly observing the progression of these skills throughout the age groups. Nipper age managers, assisting parents and most of all our nippers, great job.

Rod Jordan again provided the skill to deliver a very high

standard of proficiency Advanced Resuscitation requalification to those members holding this award. The training team withheld completing new ART awards during this season, due to Covid 19, and the emphasis Rod places on “hands on” training and assessment. This award will be further promoted, hopefully next season with an easing of group training requirements.

The IRB team were perhaps most effected by the Covid restrictions, due to the close contact required during training sessions. All proficiency training was reduced to delegate competency-based assessment. IRB crew and driving requires major motivation in the following seasons to enable strong development within each patrol.

External awards through Central Coast Branch and Surf NSW were not promoted this season, again due to our simple training approach this season, and will require much more involvement from the training team in promotion and development of awards including Patrol Captains, IRB Driving, Advanced First Aid, Training Officers and Assessors.

With seven years as the Director of Education, and many more years as the Chief Training Officer, and even more as a Training officer and Assessor at MacMasters Beach, my time has come to step down from official duty within the club's management team. I will continue to join Fergie and the balance of the training team in delivering skill training to our current and new members, plus support Lyn Drummond, in her new role as the Director of Education at MacMasters Beach SLSC.

What a year with everyone back on the beach after the eerie quiet of the previous summer!

New guidelines required to manage the beach for Covid-19 and changes to the Patrol Roster as events moved around were a nightmare. It takes great people, in a great club, to maintain our service on the beach each week under pressure, thank you all for your patience and support.

Our 12 patrols completed 6,580 hours between the flags to maintain a safe beach for 67,000 members of the public. No lives were lost, 53 first aids, 6 rescues and 879 preventions completed.

The gear and equipment we use on the beach constantly wears out and the donation of a new Thunder Cat IRB hull by Pauline Hancock, in memory of her husband Les, is greatly appreciated.

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 2009*, the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*, the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991* and associated regulations. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

MacMasters Beach Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is an association registered under the *Associations Incorporations Act 2009* and domiciled in New South Wales.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purpose of complying with the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commissions Act 2012* and associated regulations. The Board have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of the MacMasters Beach Surf Life Saving Club Limited.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the AASB and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements'; AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows'; AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors'; AASB 1048 'Interpretations of Standards' as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Accounting Policies

Revenue

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Sale of goods

Sale of goods revenue is recognised at the point of sale, which is when the customer takes receipt of the goods, the risks and rewards are transferred to the customer and there is a valid sales contract. Amounts disclosed as revenue are net of sales returns and discounts.

Membership fees

Revenue from membership fees is recognised at time of receipt.

Functions and Events

Revenue from functions and events are recognised once the event is held in the Club facilities and has met its obligations to provide a venue for the expressed purpose agreed with the parties.

Grants and donations

Grant & donation income is recognised as revenue when received unless they are designated for a specific purpose, where they are carried forward as prepaid income on the balance sheet.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Buildings

Buildings are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event that the carrying amount of buildings is greater than its estimated recoverable amount the decrease in value is shown in the profit and loss statement as a revaluation decrease.

Plant and Equipment / Surf Patrol Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised in the profit or loss as revaluation decreases if the impairment losses relate to the revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, including buildings and capitalised lease assets is depreciated on a straight line or diminishing-value basis over the asset's useful life to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss in the period which they arise. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included in other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Income Tax

As the company is a charitable institution in the terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the entity and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

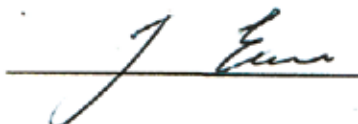
